LAW MAY BE REPLACED WITH NEW POLICY FRAMEWORK

Govt repeals B&B law months after Hauz Rani fire killed 23

DELHI IS overhauling the way bed-and-breakfast establishments operate in the city, with the State Assembly Tuesday approving a proposal to repeal a nearly two-decade-old law governing them. It plans to replace it with a new policy framework.

The move comes after a fire at a B&B in Malviya Nagar claimed 23 lives in June and triggered a city-wide crackdown on properties violating safety norms and building bylaws.

More than 750 B&B establishments are currently registered with the Delhi Tourism Department under the existing law. The government stated that the proposed changes are aimed at keeping pace with the changing tourism and hospitality sector and making the rules more flexible.

The Delhi Bed and Breakfast Establishments (Repeal) Bill, 2026 was introduced in the Assembly on Tuesday, repealing the National Capital Territory of

Delhi (Incredible India) Bed and Breakfast Establishments (Registration and Regulation) Act, 2007, along with its amendments of 2010 and 2021.

The existing B&B Act was enacted in 2007, at a time when online accommodation booking platforms were not widely available. Speaking during the Monsoon Session, BJP Minister Manjinder Singh Sirsa: "The act is very old and has several shortcomings. We also witnessed a fire incident in which many innocent people lost their lives."

He also said the government is considering replacing the existing statutory framework

with a policy-based system that would provide greater flexibility while ensuring necessary checks and balances. "We want to deregulate it to an extent and improve the compliance pattern. The Government of India also has a B&B policy, which we are studying. Based on what emerges, a framework will be prepared and a better policy will be brought for Delhi," Sirsa said.

According to the Bill, the repeal will come into force on a date to be notified by the government in the Official Gazette. To avoid creating panic among people already registered and running B&Bs in the city, the proposed Bill provides that existing registrations, certificates, orders, approvals and proceedings under the repealed Acts will continue to remain valid, as long as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of the new Act.

It also states that the repeal will not affect the previous operation of the laws or anything already done under them.

As per the document, Tourism

Minister Kapil Mishra cited the need for a "flexible" policy. "Over a period of time, the tourism and hospitality sector has undergone significant transformation, including the emergence of new forms of accommodation and evolving policy approaches. In this context, it has been considered necessary to discontinue the existing statutory framework governing bed and breakfast establishments and to replace it with a more flexible and facilitative policy regime," read the bill document undersigned by Mishra.

Mishra said the government proposes to revamp and re-initiate the regulation and promotion of B&B establishments through an executive policy framework, which would be implemented in a more liberalised manner, while continuing to ensure compliance with applicable laws. "... During the transition period, fresh registrations and processing of pending applications under the existing Act shall remain in abeyance," it read.

LAST DAY OF DELHI ASSEMBLY'S MONSOON SESSION

AAP protests in Assembly against rice 'scam', MLAs marshalled out

ON THE last day of the Monsoon Session Tuesday, AAP leaders staged a protest in the Delhi Assembly against alleged irregularities in rice procurement. The leaders shouted slogans and threw rice in the House, following which eight were marshalled out of the Assembly.

The leaders also demanded the resignation of Food and Supplies Minister Manjinder Singh Sirsa. The MLAs squatted on the floor in front of LoP Atishi's office, with rice sacks before them, and raised slogans like: "Gareeb ka chawal kahan gaya?" (Where did the rice meant for the poor go?). Sirsa said they neither bought, nor sold any rice.

"We had a representation from a company. I only wrote 'May be considered as per rules'. I think, the Opposition has no real issue left to raise... I will take them to court..." Speaking to *The Indian Express*, Sirsa said he will send a defamation notice to AAP's Delhi unit president Saurabh Bharadwaj and MLA Sanjeev Jha. "This is the same old politics of the Aam Aadmi Party and Arvind Kejriwal Ji—when ever the BJP government works for Delhi's people, bring out new accusations and stories to divert attention," Sirsa wrote on X.

Bharadwaj, addressing Sirsa, wrote: "A responsible minister should calmly answer the opposition's questions. Don't try to intimidate by threatening court action." "Crores of rupees were earned as illegal commission," he said in another post.

Sprinkling pesticides to remove termites: CM slams AAP regime

HITTING OUT at the previous AAP government, Chief Minister Rekha Gupta on Tuesday said her government is "sprinkling pesticides" to remove the "termites" that had infested the system and affected governance, development and the implementation of schemes and projects. Addressing the Assembly on the last day of the Monsoon Session, Gupta, while citing findings of the CAG reports tabled in the House, said the previous government, steeped in scams, was headed by a chief minister (Arvind Kejriwal) who did not hold a single portfolio.

"Two major reports tabled in the House were, infact, a report card. The report card had been prepared neither by the Opposition nor the government or any political party. It had been prepared by the CAG, the country's highest constitutional audit institution... The audit institution has explained in detail how irregularities took place in the use of public money and Delhi's funds were misused during the tenure of the previous government," she added.

The CAG report on Delhi's electricity subsidy scheme had said that subsidy expenditure had increased from Rs 2,405.59 crore in 2019-20 to Rs 3,161 crore in 2022-23. It added that the policy "did not target the deserving and disadvantaged section of the population and paid it to nearly the entire domestic consumer base".

The second CAG report said that Delhi's e-procurement system used common PAN

numbers and identical email IDs, pointing to possible collusion and cover bidding. The report, which examined the system between 2017-18 and 2022-23, found that in 7,181 tenders worth Rs 3,21,744 crore, involving 14,527 valid bids, bidders had used the same IP addresses. "We are sprinkling pesticides and AAP's termites are coming out," the CM said.

Gupta alleged that the AAP government had "committed scams in all departments — from education to health".

She said that of the Rs 80,798-

crore Budget in 2024-25, "only around Rs 61,000 crore was spent out...". She claimed that if capital expenditure had been undertaken in public interest, roads and flyovers could have been built, schools could have been opened and other essential development works could have been carried out.

"But this was not the previous government's focus, the CM said. "Its objective was to find ways to commit scams, siphon off money & mislead people by putting up large photographs even without doing the work."

BMW mows down woman crossing road in Delhi Cantt, locals protest

A 48-YEAR-OLD woman was killed after she was allegedly hit by a BMW in the Delhi Cantonment area on Tuesday afternoon.

Police said the accused, Deepak, 38, was apprehended. A resident of Pratap Nagar in Mandoli, he worked as a driver and was returning from the Delhi Airport.

The accident triggered a protest by local residents, who blocked the road for nearly three hours, disrupting traffic movement towards Terminal-3 (T-3) of the airport.

According to police, they received a PCR call regarding the accident at the Delhi Cantt police station around noon.

A police team reached the spot, but the injured woman had already been shifted to Deen Dayal Upadhyay Hospital, where doctors declared her dead.

The woman was identified as Jaiwanti, 48, a resident of East Mehram Nagar. Police said she worked as a cleaner with the Cantonment Board. A preliminary inquiry revealed that Jaiwanti was crossing the road

when she was allegedly hit by the BMW.

Describing the incident, local resident Sonu Prajapati said, "She was a resident of this village and belonged to the Valmiki community. She was returning home from work for lunch and was crossing the road when the BMW came at high speed and hit her. She was thrown to the ground and seriously injured."

"When people in the village came to know that one of our women was lying injured on the road, everyone gathered at the spot. The villagers then blocked the road in protest. The road remained blocked for around two-and-a-half to three hours. Senior police officers eventually came to the spot and assured us that the accused had

been apprehended and that action would be taken at the earliest," he said.

The resident also raised concerns about road safety in the area, claiming that accidents had occurred there in the past. "There is a school barely 50 metres from the spot, yet no adequate safety measures have been put in place... What happened today was extremely serious. A woman has lost her life," Prajapati added.

According to the resident, the road is an important and heavily used stretch connecting the airport terminals and other major routes.

For Jaiwanti's three children, the accident has left them facing both an emotional and financial crisis.

Her daughter, Bindu, said, "We lost our father... our mother was the sole breadwinner of the family... we cannot fathom the fact that she is gone..."

"We have already lost several members of our family, one after the other, and now this has happened. We want justice for our mother and a permanent solution to our financial difficulties so we can survive," she added.

New PM-POSHAN menu: Idli-sambar in govt schools soon

IDLI-SAMBAR will soon be on the plates of students in Delhi government schools, with the dish set to be introduced within two weeks under a revised PM-POSHAN menu that also replaces *ragi halwa* with wheat

flour and *chana masala*, and vegetable *daliya* with jowar and bajra. The Directorate of Education (DoE) has directed the schools and implementing agencies to make the necessary arrangements by August 24.

The revised menu replaces some of the existing meal items and includes *poori* with black

chana gravy, rice with *chhole* and mashed vegetables, *poori* with *chhole*, rice with dal and rice with *kadhi*, as per an order issued by the DoE on Monday.

While most of the revised menu will come into force immediately, idli with sambar has been given a two-week transition period as its preparation

requires specific equipment, specialised ingredients, dedicated infrastructure and trained manpower, it said.

The meal review panel recommended the changes after reviewing the existing weekly menu, meal coverage, stakeholder feedback and implementation experience, the DoE said.
