HAD GOOGLED WAYS TO COMMIT SUICIDE: POLICE

Shahdara man kills wife, daughter before ending life; son critical

REELING UNDER supposed financial difficulties, a 43-year-old man allegedly slit the throat of his wife, his 13-year-old son and 6-year-old daughter, killing two of them, before hanging himself inside his house in Shahdara's Jyoti Colony Tuesday morning, police officers said.

The deceased was identified as Sushil, who goes only by his first name, a Maintenance Supervisor in Delhi Metro at East Vinod Nagar Depot. His wife Anuradha, also 43, was a homemaker. The girl, who died in the incident, studied in Class 1 in a government school in which the teenager is a Class 8 student. The boy is currently admitted to the GTB hospital and is said to be in a critical condition.

An FIR under relevant sections of the IPC has been lodged in the matter, said police.

According to police, they received a call around 12 PM from a colleague of Sushil, who said that the latter, when contacted for not reporting to work, said that he had killed his family inside his house. When he stopped responding to any calls after this, the friend, Sudhir Kumar, contacted the police.

DCP (Shahdara) Rohit Meena said that while Anuradha's body was found on

the floor with her throat slit, the bodies of Sushil and his daughter, along with his critically injured son, were lying in an adjacent room.

"As per preliminary investigation from the documents received at the spot, the accused had mortgaged jewellery and taken loans, due to which he was under financial burden...his phone has been sent for forensic analysis and further facts will be revealed after that," said the DCP.

Sushil was among the youngest of three brothers, all of whom lived in the same three-storey building in Jyoti Colony. While Sushil and his family used to live on the top floor, two other brothers and their families live on the second and ground floor.

Another brother had died of

Covid in 2020.

The daughter of Sushil's eldest brother, Monica, told *The Indian Express*, "I woke up at around 10 AM on Tuesday and neither I nor the other family members present inside the house heard any noise...I heard Sushil's daughter crying during early morning hours but considered it normal since she is just a child...Sushil's family also owned a Labrador named Sam who also kept barking throughout the morning hours but even that was not considered as suspicious to us...we only got to know about the incident after police broke open both the doors on the top floor as they were locked and found the bodies of the family members in separate rooms."

A senior police officer said that when the cops broke open

the door to Sushil's room, they found the computer on, adding one of the windows on his system had videos on ways to kill oneself.

"It seems that around 10 AM, after attacking his family members, all of whom were up by that time, Sushil searched for ways to kill himself online and decided to finally hang himself. He initially tried to hang himself using a scarf but then resorted to using a rope...we recovered two kitchen knives from the rooms. It seems that one of the knives got bent during the crime following which he used another," said the officer.

Officers said that before committing the murders, Sushil chained his dog to the stairs leading to the third floor, seemingly to prevent it from waking up other family members. Sushma, Anuradha's sister, said that her sister often used to talk about her financial problems.

"My sister used to make Youtube videos and had garnered nearly 1 lakh subscribers...she told me that she wanted to monetise her account," said Sushma.

DMRC, in a statement, said that since it was a police case, the corporation did not want to comment on the incident. "Any assistance or information needed by the authorities would be duly provided," it added.

Gurgaon: Chintels residents stage protest at DM office

Gurgaon: A day after the district magistrate ordered that towers E and F at Chintels Paradiso in Gurgaon's Sector 109 be vacated within 15 days, the residents staged a protest at the DM office on Tuesday. The residents submitted a letter to Additional

Deputy Commissioner Hitesh Kumar Meena, stating their demands.

Following the protest that saw a turnout of 50-60 people at 11 am, the ADC has agreed to meet with the RWA president 1 pm on May 18. The meeting will

also be attended by the ACP, Udyog Vihar, PWD officials, the developer, and the district town planner (enforcement).

The ADC told *The Indian Express*: "We want to find a middle ground and the meeting is aimed at that so the residents do

not feel they are unheard," said ADC Meena.

The residents demanded 120 days' time to vacate the towers. They also said the possession of the house should remain with the flat owners till final settlements. ENS

SOPs for tourist police vans issued

New Delhi: Delhi Police Tuesday released a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for tourist police vans ahead of the G-20 summit in Delhi. Police said personality development classes, training on curbing tourist-related malpractices and deployment of English-speaking staff are part of the guidelines. The order stated that the staff will be taught soft skills, personality development, communication in English, ways to enhance etiquette, manners, attitude and behaviour towards tourists. Delhi Police Commissioner Sanjay Arora will conduct a monthly inspection of the tourist vans. ENS

Soon, trekking trail on Yamuna floodplains

New Delhi: The Yamuna floodplains are set to have an 11-kilometre-long trekking-cum-adventure trail on its eastern banks as part of its restoration and development. The foundation stone of the Trekking and Adventure Track, which will be connected by a trail passing through trees, grasslands and flower beds up to the Asita Ghat at the ITO barrage, was laid down by L-G Vinai Kumar Saxena at Signature Bridge Tuesday. The trail will be constructed by the Eco Battalion of the Territorial Army in association with the DDA. ENS

Concrete from Metro viaduct falls on car

New Delhi: A piece of concrete from a viaduct near Ghitomi Metro station fell on a moving car, damaging the vehicle, officials said Tuesday. However, no one was injured in the incident, a senior DMRC official said. "The Delhi Metro Rail Corporation will conduct an inquiry into the cause of the incident," he said. The DMRC said, "A piece of concrete...fell on the road, hitting a car...passing by at that time. The car was damaged by the impact, but there was no injury." DMRC said it would bear the cost of repairing of the car. PTI

ON MINORITY QUOTA

DU 'insisting on admission as per CUET score only', JMC moves HC

JESUS AND Mary College has moved the Delhi High Court against a Delhi University notification "insisting on 100% weightage for CUET" score for admission to minority quota in the college, seeking that it be declared unconstitutional.

The plea moved by advocate Romy Chacko was listed before a division bench of Chief Justice Satish Chandra Sharma and Justice Subramonium Prasad Tuesday, which issued notice to the respondents - DU and UGC - and listed it on May 24 along with a plea moved by St Stephens College on a similar issue.

The plea sought quashing of a

December 8, 2022 decision of the executive council of DU that with effect from academic year 2023, admission of both undergraduate and postgraduate students under the minority quota will be solely based on their CUET score.

In addition, the plea sought a declaration that DU's decision to insist on 100% weightage for CUET score for admission to minority quota is ultra vires (beyond the powers) Article 30 and hence, unconstitutional.

Article 30 of the Constitution states the right of minorities to establish and administer educational institutions.

The plea refers to a September 2022 decision of the HC which stated that while St Stephens College retains authority to conduct interviews in addition to the

CUET for admission of students from the minority community, it cannot devise a policy forcing non-minorities to undergo an interview as well.

JMC has said that the HC had upheld the right of St Stephens College to interview Christian students before the final selection, giving a weightage of 15% marks to the process. Subsequently, St. Stephen's College filed a plea before the Supreme Court challenging the HC judgment to the extent that it had upheld DU's communications, directing the college to admit candidates in general category solely based on CUET score. The plea stated that while this case is pending in the SC, DU's executive council issued the notification on the same in December 2022.

Jail superintendent who moved 3 inmates to Jain's cell transferred

DAYS AFTER Delhi jail administration issued a show-cause notice to the superintendent of Tihar jail number 7 for moving three men to the cell of former Delhi home minister Satyendra Jain, the superintendent has been transferred to another jail.

An order was passed in this regard by the Superintendent, Headquarters, Tuesday and approved by Director General (Prisons) Sanjay Beniwal. The order stated that officer Rajesh Choudhary, superintendent of jail no. 7, has been transferred to jail no. 1, which is the headquarters at Tihar prison complex. The present jail superintendent at jail no. 1 will now look after jail no. 2 and the vigilance department, the order further stated.

On May 11, Jain submitted an application with a request to change his cell, citing depression and "doctor's advice for more so-

cial interactions". Jain, in his application, said he was feeling depressed and low because of loneliness. After a jail doctor advised him more social interactions, he requested to be lodged with at least two more persons. "He also provided two persons' names...The next day, three inmates were transferred to Jain's cell by the superintendent," said an officer.

When the matter came to light, Beniwal said a show-cause notice was issued to the jail superintendent and the inmates were transferred back to their respective cells. The jail administration also said they will get the opinions of other doctors to analyse Jain's health and seek treatment if needed.

Jain was arrested by the ED on May 30, 2022. In March this year, the ED, probing a 2017 money laundering case against Jain, pointed to his conduct and "influence" in Tihar jail before the Delhi High Court to argue that he had received "preferential treatment".
