INTRODUCTION

ORGANISATION PROFILE

THDCIL (formerly known as Tehri Hydro Development Corporation Ltd.) is a Mini Ratna Schedule 'A' CPSE under the Ministry of Power. THDCIL, set up in 1988, is a Joint Venture of Govt. of India and Govt. of Uttar Pradesh, with equity sharing in the ratio of 3:1 between GoI and GoUP for the Power Component.

The initial mandate of the company was to develop Tehri Hydro Power Complex (2400 MW) comprising of Tehri HEP, Stage-I (1000 MW), Tehri PSP (1000 MW) and Koteshwar HEP (400 MW) in Uttarakhand. THDCIL is now a multi project Corporation, with presence in various States and neighbouring country (Bhutan). Apart from two plants under operation (1,400 MW), THDCIL today has a portfolio of 12 Hydro power projects, including 3 under construction (1,468 MW), 9 under various stages of Survey & Investigation / DPR (4,602 MW), totalling to an Installed Capacity of 7,470 MW. In addition, THDCIL has been allotted the Khurja Super Thermal Power Plant (2x660 MW) in UP for implementation. The Company has an authorised share capital of ₹ 4,000 cr. Paid up Capital of the Company as on 31.03.2012 is ₹ 3,342.58 Cr.

The installed capacity of THDCIL is 1400 MW with the commissioning of Tehri HPP (4x250 MW) in Xth plan and commissioning of Koteshwar HEP (4x100 MW) during 2011-12. THDCIL has also obtained ISO 9001:2008 Certificate of Quality Management System and ISO 14001-2004 Certification (Environment Management System) for Corporate Office, Rishikesh, Tehri HPP, Tehri PSP, Koteshwar HEP and Vishnugad Pipalkoti HEP. THDCIL has also obtained OHSAS 18001:2007 (Occupational Health and Safety Management System) Certification for Corporate Office, Rishikesh.

The execution of Tehri Dam and HPP (1000MW) is a landmark achievement in the history of large dams involving huge rehabilitation and resettlement issues, despite opposition of the project on safety, social and environmental issues apart from tackling of geological challenges encountered during construction of the project. THDC successfully handled all such issues and has emerged as a consistently profit making and dividend paying CPSU since the commissioning of Tehri HPP in 2006-07.

THDCIL has developed the capabilities to undertake Hydro Power Projects from Concept to Commissioning. THDCIL has taken initiatives to diversify into non conventional sources viz. Solar and Wind Energy sector.



CSR VISION, MISSION & POLICY

THDCIL vision statement includes Commitment to Environment, Ecology and Social Values. Its Mission statement accepts Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR), including Rehabilitation and Resettlement of Project Affected Persons (PAFs) with a human face. THDCIL seeks to adopt best practices in Corporate Governance, Sustainability and Environmental Protection.

THDCIL's approach to CSR is based on sustainable development through long-term and short term projects. The project Management and Monitoring skills available with THDCIL could be shared as far as possible, with the local administration by training and setting up required structure and systems for implementation of CSR activities. The CSR activities of company are being implemented as per CSR and sustainability policy 2013 which have been framed under DPE guidelines. The Board of Directors has approved the "CSR & Sustainability Policy-2013" which is framed in line with the new DPE Guideline on CSR & Sustainability effective from 01.04.2013.

As per revised policy the ambit of CSR and sustainability includes internal stakeholder (particularly the employees of company), earlier which was focused for external stakeholders.

THDCIL's CSR activities have been planned in synchronisation with the UN Global Compact Principles pertaining to the Environment. It inter-alia requires to:-

- Support a precautionary approach to environmental challenges.
- Undertake initiative to promote greater environmental responsibility.
- Encourage the development and diffusion of environmental friendly technologies.
- Encourage capacity building programs for future sustainable development.
- Upliftment of the marginalised and under-privileged sections of the society and development of backward regions.

Every year THDCIL, with the approval of its Board of Directors will make a non lapsable budgetary allocation for CSR & Sustainability activities/projects for the year as per the provisions of the DPE guideline / new Companies Act.

The budgetary allocation will be based on the profitability of the company. More specifically, it will be determined by the Profit After Tax (PAT) of the company in the previous year. During 2013-14, THDCIL earmarked 2.0% of Net Profit After Tax.

CSR INITIATIVES

APPROACH AND METHODOLOGY

Various CSR schemes on Sustainable basis are being implemented by the THDCIL in the area of health & Hygiene, Education Development, Environment, Skill development, Agriculture & rural development etc. mainly for project affected population. People are being motivated to come forward and take ownership of CSR programmes. Local NGOs from project affected areas are also being promoted to become close associates/partners of SEWA-THDC in long run.

The company implements CSR & Sustainability projects as per the rule and directives from GoI through a department with trained dedicated team members headed by GM (Social & Environment). The projects are executed through company sponsored NGO i.e. **SEWA-THDC** which deals with social initiatives & education through **THDC Education Society.** Both implementation agencies are annually audited.

THDC India Ltd has formed a Company sponsored Non-Government Organization, "SEWA-THDC" under Societies Registration Act, 1860, on dated 17.03.2009 for the implementation of the CSR-SD activities of the Company. SEWA-THDC has started working since 2009-10.

BUDGET ALLOCATION

During 2013-14, THDCIL earmarked 2.0% (₹10.63 Cr.) of Net Profit After Tax (₹ 531.38 Cr.) to Non-Lapsable CSR fund for implementation of THDCIL CSR-CD Scheme.

THDC EDUCATION SOCIETY (TES)

TES was formed as a society in the year 1992 to impart education to the children of Project affected population as well as marginalised and under privileged society in the backward district of Tehri and Rishikesh.

The company is running two schools under the auspices of THDC education society (TES), one at Bhagirathipuram, Tehri offering education from 6^{th} to 12^{th} standards and one at Pragatipuram, Rishikesh offering education from 1^{st} to 10^{th} standards. In both the schools children of nearby areas belonging in economically weaker sections including backward and SC/ST are being provided quality education.

During the year, many initiatives have been taken up to improve quality of education. Experienced Principals with army/central school background have been appointed on contract basis in both the schools to ensure effective superintendence and administration. Extracurricular activities are organized from time to time like summer camps, excursion tours etc. The students are trained for cultural programmes and National Festivals. The initiatives taken by TES have resulted in increase in the strength of the students in both the schools at Tehri (190 students) and Rishikesh (466 students). Teachers are also provided with training from time to time to improve their skills.





CSR PROJECT PORTFOLIOS



The community development identified programmes are and formulated based on the specific needs and requirement of the particular location, where the programme is proposed be launched. The basic domains of the programmes are as under:

THDCIL intigrates its CSR & Sustainability plans and strategy with its business plans and strategies. For easy implementation, CSR projects are categorized into short, medium and long-term in view of the priortiries.

The company accords priority for CSR & SD Projects to those stakeholders who are directly impacted by its operations. To meet the challenges of dynamically transforming business environment and setting global benchmarks, the revised guidelines envisage a two-tier structure, comprising of a Board level Committee and a Below Board Level Committee headed by a senior executive of not less than one rank below the Board level to steer the CSR and Sustainability agenda of the company.

The company is truly committed to the welfare of and development of Project Affected People (PAPs) and community at large in a sustainable and efficient manner.




A. INFRASTRUCTURE FOR COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT



In order to provide ease of living to the future technicians and engineering professionals in the power and engineering sector, THDCIL took initiative to plan construction of Engineering College (THDC-IHET) in Tehri in the state of Uttarakhand.

The major activities during 2013-14 are indicated below:


1. In the year 2013-14, construction of 3rd year acedemic block was fnished and construction for the 4th year acedemic block started at Institute of Hydropower Engineering & Technology, Tehri in the state of Uttarakhand. The Institute aims to provide a unique experience to the students with education and training in the plants under operation and the projects under



construction. The THDC-IHET is spread over 20 acres of land with state of the art infrastructural facilities, such as administrative block, academic blocks, laboratories, workshop, library, hostels, canteen etc. The infrastructure and furnishing work has already been completed for running 1st, 2nd & 3rd year classes in five disciplines i.e Civil, Mechanical,


Electrical, Electronics and Communication and Computer Science. Construction of 4th year block is expected to be finished by august 2014

2. Sulabh Shouchalaya, New Tehri: Sulabh Shouchalaya in New Tehri, Block Chamba, (Tehri Garhwal) has been constructed through implementing agency UPRNN, New Tehri.






- **3. Yatri shed:** Under public welfare schemes 02 nos., Yatri shed have been constructed at Rajakhet Tiraha and Bhoniyada Tiraha in district Tehri.
- 4. Community Hall, Bagon, Patti Nagun: Construction of Community Hall with Toilet in vill.



- Bagon, Patti -Nagun, Block Thauldhar, District Tehri.
- **5.** To provide better education facility, existing school building of Shri Gandhi Mahila Shilp Vidhyalaya Inter College, Roorkee was repaired.
- **6.** Two disaster relief halls at village Khand Block Jakhnidhar and Lambgaon, Block Pratapnagar, Distt. Tehri were constructed for village and community development.
- 7. Up gradation of water flour mills (Gharats):
 05 water flour mill (Gharats) have been modified/upgraded as per engineering specifications for higher efficiency at village Ranidang, Sankri, Pilkhi and Thapla of block Bhilangna distt. Tehri Garhwal. The work was carried out through Uttarakhand Renewable Energy Development Agency (UREDA). Through this project, population of 04 nearby villages have been benefitted.



8. MoU has been signed between THDCIL & RECL for construction of Girl's hostel-2 for THDC Institute of Hydropower Engineering & Technology. Under the agreement, RECL is assisting with ₹ 400 lakhs against the total estimate cost of ₹ 524 lakhs to SEWA-THDC. The work is under progress by Deptt. means and is likely to be completed during April 2015.

- 9. Rebuilding and reconstruction works in Uttarakhand by power PSUs. Due to heavy rainfall in Uttarakhand, a huge damage occurred on 16/17 June 2013. To provide relief to the flood victims, under guidance of Honourable State Minister of Power (I/C), GoI, Power CPSUs decided to share ₹ 25.00 Cr. CSR fund in Rebuilding and Reconstruction works in Uttarakhand. THDCIL has shared ₹1.00 Cr. for the relief activities
- **10. Installation of 50 nos. solar street light**: SEWA-THDC has been installed 50 nos. solar street light at Tehri Dam visthapit chhetra, Bhaniyawala, district Dehradun through UREDA.
- **11. Construction of individual toilets:** A MoU has been signed with Sulabh International for construction of 21 nos. individual toilets at Deengoan, block Pratapnagar, Distt. Tehri.

B. EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT



Receiving a good education helps empower people, thus, makes people strong enough to look after themselves in any given situation. It's only through knowledge that one can be able to question authority for its negligence or discrepancies. It is a right of a citizen who can seek improvement in the structural functioning of governance and economy. It's only when a citizen is aware about the policies of its government and he or she can able to support or protest the change. As a whole, people can bring about development only when they know where improvement is necessary for the greater good of mankind. Hence, following initiatives were taken:-

- 1. THDCIL is running two schools, one in **Bhagirathipuram** named **THDC Inter College** near Tehri HPP and another is **THDC High School at Rishikesh Campus**. Both the schools are running under CSR through **THDC Education Society** (Society registered under societies registration act 1860).
- 2. In THDC Inter College, at present, Science and Art streams are running for class XI and XII and in future Commerce stream will also be added. To enhance the knowledge and personality development, co-curricular activities viz. Yoga, Poem recitation, Quiz, Essay Writing, Games, Cultural Programme, Drawing etc. are organized regularly.



- 3. In both schools, free uniform, books and stationary, free bus service for students, fee concession for SC/ST/BPL students, and 100% scholarship for SC/ST students have been provided.
- 4. Construction of extra room in Shiv Sanskrit Vidyalaya at Silawaal Gaon, Block Pratapnagar (Tehri Garhwal).
- 5. Providing furniture at Saraswati Vidya Mandir, Bhaniyawala. & Govt. Higher Secondary School, Pathri (Haridwar).



6. SMART CLASSES THROUGH MULTIMEDIA SYSTEM K-YAN: Multimedia education provider machine has been provided to the Deen Gaon School, THDC Inter College, B. Puram, THDC High School, Rishikesh and GIC Rehab area, Pashulok. Two smart class education centres have also been established for education development in Project Affected Area at Chinyalisaur, district Uttarkashi and at Pratapnagar, district Tehri Garhwal.

7. **COMPUTER TRAINING PROGRAMMES**: To promote computer education, 6 months computer skill training program has been organised in 05 remote locations of Project affected areas with the guidance of NASSCOM Foundation, New Delhi. The programme was organised at Ghansali, Padagali, block Bhilangana, Koteshwar, block Narendranagar, Rajakhet, block Jakhanidhar in district Tehri and Dehrakhas (Rehab colony district Dehradun). Approx 350 unemployed youth have been benefited from the Computer Training Programme.



8. **HOTEL MANAGEMENT TRAINING**: One year Hotel Management Training was given to 42 nos. youth from Project Affected Areas to enhance their employability. The training was provided from Kukreja Institute of Hotel Management- Dehradun, Korbett Institute of Hotel Management- Dehradun, Trihari Institute of Management Education-New Tehri and Anpurana Food Craft Institute- Chamba, Tehri.

C. ENVIROMENTAL DEVELOPMENT



THDC is committed to development of power in a sustainable manner. The vision document of THDCIL states as:

"A major global player in power sector, providing quality affordable and sustainable power with commitment to environment, ecology and social value & create work ethos of growth through professionalism and achievement of excellence"

THDCIL is not confined to preserving and protecting environment in relation to its project activities only. Considering it as one of our social responsibility, Company has gone further in its efforts to upgrade the environment near the project areas.



- 1. Development of Herbal Garden in Dhontri Patti- Gajna (Uttarkashi).
- 2. Plantation in Rim area of Tehri reservation.
- 3. Total 32,425 saplings of different varieties of fruits and herbs planted in the rim area of Tehri reservoir and other project affected areas/rehab colonies through SEWA-THDC
- 4. Organization & Demonstration on vegetable crops & distribution of seeds for PAP's. Distribution of 14750 nos of different varieties fruits plants to villagers of project affected areas in Tehri.
- 5. Distribution of 650 no fruit plants to Rehabilitees of Bhaniyawala with organization of Kisham Ghosthi.







D. HEALTH AND VETERINARY CARE



As per geographic conditions of district Tehri, most of the area is on the hills and consists of rural area. Being remote & long distance from the main approach, there is a dearth of proper medical services in the area.

- 1. Assistance for Dal Bhaat Yojna at Govt. Hospital, NTT
- 2. Multipurpose camp and health camp for Disabled Persons at Muni-Ki-Reti (Tehri Garhwal) has also been organised.
- 3. During the year, 18 medical camps with Multispecialty Medical Health Camps were organized through Niramal Eye Institute, Rishikesh & Shri Krishna Sewa Ashram, Rishikesh in the project affected area and rehab colonies. Total 3744 Patients attended the camps for taking medical treatment. Out of these, 419 critical patients have undergone cataract surgery.





- 4. A medical health camp has been organized at village Jugiyana, Mohna Chatti (Pauri Garhwal) in collaboration with Rotary Foundation. Approx 200 Patients attended the camps for taking medical treatment
- 5. 03 Homeopathy Dispensaries have been running effectively at Galyakhet (Partapngar), Dhauntari (Uttarkashi) & Koteshwar (Narendar Nagar). Every day on an average 150 patients (OPD) are availing free consultations and free medicines.





Total 45000 nos. of patients have been benefited in these dispensaries during the year. In Rishikesh also, assistance is given to a homeopathy dispensary in terms of medicines, where free treatment is given mainly to economically weaker section people.

- 6. One Tri-cycle is provided to a disabled person at IIT Roorkee, Distt. Haridwar.
- 7. Distribution of apparatus for Disabled School Children of Jyoti Special School, Rishikesh.



E. WELFARE ACTIVITY



- 1. Financial assistance for promotion of culture and sports to Govt. PG College, New Tehri,
 - project affected villagers in Bhaniyawala, Dehradun and MJ-JT-HEPs District-Chamoli.
- 2. Awareness program through mobile van at Prtapngar (Tehri). During financial year 2013 -14, 241 employees were sensitized on CSR and sustainability. Top level management executives and employees actively participated and benefitted out of this training. External



stakeholders especially, PAP s were also sensitized at Tehri, Koteshwar & VPHEP (Chamoli). 2400 nos. people were given awareness about CSR policy/ activities.

3. Distribution of 200 nos. solar lanterns in flood affected area, Ganjna Patti (Uttarkashi)









- 4. THDCIL as an industry partner under Corporate Social Responsibilities has already established a library at a cost of ₹ 3.3 lacs and provided LCD projector and audio system worth ₹ 1.5 lacs to ITI Chamba.
- 5. Furniture and Fixtures worth approx ₹ 1.42 lakhs have been provided by THDC for COPA trade and books worth ₹ 46000/- have also been provided for the library.
- 6. Establishment of training/awareness program centre by providing chairs, utensils etc. to grampanchayats in Pathri block (03 Hamlets)
- 7. Various CSR workshop/training/awareness programs have been organized for internal & external stakeholders

F. WOMEN EMPOWERMENT



- 1. 17 no. Tailoring & Knitting / production programs organized in UP and Uttarakhand for benefit and empowerment of unemployed / minorities and other weaker sections. Through these programmes over 650 unemployed / minorities and other weaker section persons got promoted.
- 2. Some of the places, where tailoring centres have been established in Tehri Garhwal like Ashena (Devri), Block Bhilangana, Gadoliya, Block Jakhnidhar, Bajrang Nagar (Raibareli),

Paniyala, Block Pratapnagar, Madan Negi, Block Jakhindihar.

- 3. Production of off-seasonal vegetable and awareness through technical awareness program and distribution of seeds for project affected people of Chamiyala area, Block Bhilangna and various location of block Thoudhar, Distt. Tehri Garhwal.
- 4. To enhance the income generation in the project affected area and



rehabilitation area. An MOU was signed with Techno park Technology Business Incubator (T-TBI), registered as a Society during 2006. Machines, tools and raw material were provided by SEWA-THDC and four centres were run as pilot projects for skill development and income generation source to about 100 people.

G. ECONOMIC AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

In order to enhance the income of the project affected population, some of the activities were undertaken during the year:

- 1. 310 no. Poultry Units, 30 no. Goat Milking Units have been established.
- 2. Seasonal vegetable, masala production and medicinal plant cultivation has been promoted for community livelihood development in Tehri through District Horticulture Department & different NGOs.
- 3. Frequent Kishan Goshthi, farmer visits and demonstration of agro based activities have been organized for project affected persons of Tehri and Chamoli District.
- 4. Agro based holistic development programmes have been undertaken as a pilot project in Hazratpur and Majhwara, villages of District Barabanki and Sultanpur respectively of Uttar Pradesh.



THDC EDUCATION SOCIETY

- 1. TES Inter College is located at B. Puram next to CISF establishment. The college has permanent buildings with class rooms & labs for Physics, Chemistry and Biology. The college has adequate furniture and well established computer lab. Presently Science and Arts streams are running in the class XIth and XIIth and in future we plan to add commerce stream also. The various inter house competition and Co-curricular activities such as Quiz, Poem Recitation, Debate, Essay Writing and Drawing etc. are being organized regularly in the college. Every year on 25th July, Suman Diwas is observed and plantation is carried out in the college campus.
- 2. Facilities Provided by THDC to THDC Inter College Bhagirathipuram to all students include free dress, books, stationery, free bus service and fee concession to SC/ST/BPL category students.
- 3. An Educational Tour to Surkanda Devi and Dhanolti was organized by the college on 12 Nov 2013 wherein total 42 students from class VI to XII participated. The children were accompanied by three teachers. The Bus and refreshment facility for the students was provided by THDCIL. The children enjoyed the tour and had a great learning experience.



4. Mr S.K. Biswas, Director, Personnel visited TES inter college, Bhagirathipuram on 22, Oct 2013. All Students and Staff Members were delighted to have the Director, Personnel





amongst them. On this occasion a brief song and dance programme was performed by the students. Director, Personnel advised that in the modern era of technology special attention should be given towards the development of communication skills and computer knowledge of the students

5. Periodic Career Counseling for the class X, XI and XII students is organized from time to time. Shri N.R. Verma, Principal, Govt Polytechnic, Naredranagar, Tehri was invited to give a talk to the students. Shri L.P. Sharma, Principal, ITI Chamba was also requested to talk to the senior students about the courses offered in ITI. A team of instructors from Shree Dev Bhoomi Institute of Education, Science and Technology, Dehradun was requested to address our senior classes about the courses and opportunities offered by the institute. The children were immensely benefitted by above talks.

SUCCESS STORIES

Success story of THDC schools Prizes etc.

- The overall success rate of High School students of Rishikesh School was 71%. The girls performed well and occupied top two ranks. Based on their performance, management has honoured the top three meritorious students with a cash prize of ₹ 4000/-,₹ 3000/- & ₹ 2500/-



- 71 students from THDC High School got scholarship after liaison with the Distt. Social Welfare Officer and their amount of scholarship was got deposited in their bank/post office accounts.
- There has been gradual improvement in the academic environment of the college. The board exam result for class 10th has improved from 75.9% to 83.3% and class 12th result has been 65% during the session 2013-14.
- The various inter house competition and Co-curricular activities such as Quiz, Poem recitation, Debate, Essay writing and Drawing etc. have been organized during the year.
- On the occasion of the Suman Diwas on 25th July 2013, a large numbers of saplings received from Municipal Board, Tehri were planted in the College premises by the students.



LONG TERM SUSTAINABLE CSR PROGRAMMES

During the year, long term CSR Programmes have been organized for holistic village development in rural areas of Distt. Tehri. Under the programme, Agriculture, Development, Livelihood Activities, Environment and Health Activities have been organised.

Holistic Development Program through HNB Garhwal University:

THDCIL has signed MOU with HNB Garhwal University for empowerment and Enhancement of Livelihood of Rim area villages of Tehri Dam Reservoir through Integrated Development Approach as a long term project.



- 1. Under the project, the main activities were to ensure sustainable livelihood, empowering women, increase income of the rural people and enhance the food security through agro based activities and Natural Resource Management.
- 2. The activities were taken in 30 villages of the Rim Area of Block Pratapnagar and Block Jakhanidhar in District Tehri Garhwal which have focused on reducing drudgery and stress among women through Regeneration and

Management of Natural Resources and traditional agriculture with new technique.

3. Various livelihood activities have been taken for the villagers, viz. Goat Rearing, Poultry Farming, Tailoring Training Programme, Agriculture Programme etc. through already

constituted over 40 Self Help Groups (SHGs) in the target villages.

- 4. Over 15000 no. fruits & fodder plants were distributed in above villages as environment promotion drive.
- 5. Livelihood activities like Crop Production, Poultry Farming etc. were organized through SHGs by providing revolving funds.



6. Total Expenditure incurred about ₹ 7.10 Lac in FY 2013-14



Livelihood Security Programme through PDFSR, Modipuram:

THDCIL has signed a MOU with Project Directorate for Farming System Research (PDFSR), Modipuram, an institution under Indian Council of Agriculture Research (ICAR) for ensuring livelihood security through farming system approach in Tehri District

1. The activities of the project have been carried out in 20 villages in clusters at Koteshwar Dam Area and Kandisaur area. During the year latest information and



technique regarding increase crop and vegetable production, goat and poultry rearing etc.


were taken in both clusters.



2. To increase the income of farmers, animal husbandry activities were taken such as de-worming, medicine for heat inductions, fodder nutrients analysis, vermin composting and mineral mixtures for balance nutrition of mulching animals. Tool kits and farming equipment were also distributed to local farmers.

Ecological Restoration and Socio-Economic Empowerment through KMC:

Restoration and Socio-Economic Empowerment of Rural Communities for Sustainable Livelihood and Resource Management at Deen Gaon through Kirorimal College, Delhi University.

THDCIL has signed MOU with Kirorimal College, Delhi University in the year 2011 initiated a programme on Ecological Restoration and Socio-economic Empowerment of Rural Communities for Sustainable Livelihood and Resource Management in Nauguda Watershed of Upali Ramoli in Pratapnagar Block of District Tehri Garhwal, Uttarakhand. This long term programme has been initiated for rural based holistic development of 10 remote villages of Tehri Region (Deen Gaon) under CSR with following major activities:



- 1. Stitching Centre opened at Deen gaon for women empowerment, to make them self sufficient. Awareness programmes were conducted for livelihood and income generation activities in the villages. To increase crop production, High Yielding Varieties of Seeds distributed.
- 2. To promote village tourism among villagers, an Eco Hut as a model was constructed.
- 3. To address the issues of the villagers, experts in various fields were invited from time to time for awareness. Efforts were made for forward linkage to promote local and traditional product including farm produce. For technical knowhow of agro based activities, Farmers Visits were conducted.



- 4. Medical camps in the area were organized as a health and welfare measure of the community. 2000 no. fruit plants were distributed in the villages for rural community development.
- 5. Various activities were initiated in the field of Education, Agriculture, Health, Horticulture, Culture, Environment Enhancement etc. Total expenditure incurred during the year was about ₹ 22.00 Lac in FY 2013-14.



Goat rearing & poultry farming project:

1. The project of Goat Rearing in the area was taken up for sustainable livelihood of Tehri dam project affected families. The project is being implemented through a NGO, Rural Area Development Society (RADS), Ranichauri, Tehri. The project included the formation of SHGs, technical training to the beneficiaries, helping 30 SHGs for purchase of goats through revolving fund, medical aids & other miscellaneous awareness related to the project. The project is undertaken in 30 villages of Pratapnagar & Dunda blocks of Tehri & Uttarkashi Districts respectively.



2. To provide an alternate source of employment generation especially to the villagers, the project of Poultry farming in the backyard was also taken up by the NGO, RADS in 54 villages of Thauldhar block of Tehri District. For poultry farming, the beneficiaries were

selected through an open gram sabha meeting and interested candidates were provided chicks by RADS.

3. On an average, 50 chicks were given to each beneficiary after required training. The main objective of the project is to empower the community & to enhance their livelihood status and bring sustainable growth. Since year 2011-12, 159 chick rearing units have been established. The beneficiaries informed that their income has increased through poultry farming



4. Similarly poultry project was taken up through NGO, "Himalayan Educational & Resource Development Society (HERDS), Chamba, Tehri in 38 villages of Pratap Nagar block of Tehri District. On an average 50 chicks were given to each beneficiary, whereas, in Deengaon, Khurmola and Onal Village beneficiaries were provided 100 chicks per beneficiary after required training

CSR MEET AT TEHRI

- 1. To promote awareness and joining hands for sharing the experience and resources, a brain storming meet was organized at B.Puram, Tehri under chairmanship of Sh. Ashok Kumar Pavadia, Joint Secy. DPE, New Delhi. CSR heads of many CPSUs, State Government representatives participated in two day conference and appreciated the initiative of THDCIL.
- 2. Feedback/suggestion boxes have been maintained at Rishikesh, Tehri, Koteshwar, Pipalkoti to have suggestions and to improve the services to the society. Information Boards also displayed along Tehri- Rishikesh Road with address, telephone and mail address to access more stockholders for feedback.
- 3. Independent evaluation of all CSR projects costing more than 5 Lac, was carried out through Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS) and contents displayed on website of THDCIL.



KEY BENEFITS

Key benefits of CSR Projects of SEWA-THDC to the Stakeholders / Community / Environment: The key benefits & impact areas of implementing the CSR innovation and activities are:

- 1. THDCIL is not confined to **preserving andprotecting environment** in relation to its project activities only. Considering it as one of our social responsibility, Company has gone further in its efforts to upgrade the environment near the project areas. Total 32,425 saplings of different varieties of fruits and herbs planted in the rim area of Tehri reservoir and other project affected area/ rehab colonies through SEWA-THDC.
- 2. Due to heavy rain fall in Uttarakhand, a huge damage occurred on 16/17 June 2013. To Provide relief to the flood victims, Power CPSUs decided to share ₹ 25 Cr. CSR fund in Rebuilding and Reconstruction works in Uttarakhand. THDCIL has shared ₹1.00 Cr. for the relief activities. In consultation with Government of Uttarakhand, Core Committee of Power CPSUs decided to reconstruct 25 nos. damaged Micro Hydel Projects, identified in district Bageshwar, Rudraptrayag, Chamoli and Tehri,
- 3. Implementation of relief measures to flood affected persons/families at Joshimath and Pipalkoti is organized in a effective way. A meeting of Project officials was held on 21.06.2013 and relief teams & coordinators for assisting the Administration were constituted. This team was in touch with SDM (Joshimath). Help required was provided to SDM (Joshimath) such as vehicles for transportation of affected persons from Joshimath to Chamoli Bus Stand. This team interacted with SDM (Chamoli) and necessary help was provided to the Administration for relief to the affected persons. Additional vehicles were provided to the administration to strengthen their mission of relief.
- 4. "Universal Excellency Award" by Aqua Foundation in Dec,2013
- 5. Rakesh Khare ED (Technical) has been awarded among top 50 CSR Professionals of the Country on 18th Feb, 2014 in Word CSR Congress, Mumbai



SOCIETY FOR EMPOWERMENT & WELFARE ACTIVITIES (SEWA), RISHIKESH SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND NOTES TO THE ACCOUNT FORMING AN INTEGRAL PART OF ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31ST MARCH 2014.

A. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:-

- (i) Basis of Accounting: The institution follows the mercantile system of accounting and recognizes income and Expenditure on Accrual basis. The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and are in accordance with the requirements of Income Tax Act, 1961 and normally accepted accounting principles.
- (ii) <u>Fixed Assets & Depreciation :-</u> Value of fixed assets is comprises of cost at which it was acquired. Depreciation on fixed assets have been taken at the rates as prescribed under Income Tax Act 1961.

B. NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS:

- (i) Equipment Distributed: SEWA has distributed various equipments in the nature of furniture to school, villages and charitable organizations/NGO's during the year for welfare activities. In some of the projects SEWA keeps the right of ownership on equipments with it and keeps watch on the same to ensure that the same has been used for the purpose it is given. However in all these cases the cost of equipments have been directly debited to cost of project and charged to income and expenditure account and has not been treated as fixed assets.
- (ii) Balance Confirmation: No confirmation from Sundry Debtors and Creditors have been obtained and these are taken as appearing in the books of accounts.
- (iii) Loans and Advances: SEWA has taken an advance from THDCIL of Rs. 56.228.941/which is shown under the heading loans and advances on the liability side of balance sheet.
- (iv) Earmarked Funds: SEWA has received the R&R funds during the current year for disaster affected area. The funds received inclusive of interest on them has been recorded as earmarked funds. The funds utilized during the year has been adjusted from the receipts.

 During the current financial year RECL has provided funds for the construction of Girls Hostel, the same has been shown as earmarked funds. The excess amount of expenditure over funds received of Rs.14,38,341/- are receivable.
- (v) Mobiles purchased during the year was not capitalized in the books, it was treated as revenue expenditure and debited to communication expense account.





- (vi) Service tax has been charged and paid under the reverse charge mechanism on the following services:
 - Manpower Supply.
 - Works Contract
 - Gross Transport Agency.

According to Notification No 15/2012-ST dated 17.03.2012 reverse charge under above mentioned services (except Gross Transport Agency) will be applicable only if, the service provider of these services is an Individual or HUF or Proprietary or partnership firm or AOP and the service receiver is a Company registered under Companies Act, 1956.

SEWA THDC being a society registered under the Society Registration Act,1860 does not fall under the reverse charge mechanism in relation to services of manpower supply and works contract. Therefore, reverse charge mechanism is not applicable to SEWA= THDC, hence, no service tax is required to be paid on these services, 100% liability is of the service provider.

- (vii) Utilization Certificate: As per SEWA-THDC norms, Utilization Certificate duly signed by the chartered accountants are not mandatory for the projects ranging between Rs.60,000-Rs.70,000.
- (viii) Properly authorized or signed documents are not available for the following projects despite of reminders served on them time and time again. This leads to non-release of their further installments which delays the project. Details of the same are as follows:




IMPACT ASSESSMENT REPORT

THDCIL annually gets its CSR project evaluated by external agencies. For the year 2013-14 TISS was given the assignment to carryout impact assessment. The key observations and conclusions of their reports are as follows.
