EVAUATION AND IMPACT ASSESSMENT REPORT 'CSR PROJECTS IMPLEMENTED IN DISTRICT TEHRI'

1. BRIEF

Govt of India in April'2010 has made it mandatory for all Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) to invest 2% to 5% of their profit on social welfare under Corporate Social Responsibility. The indicated percentage of profit of previous financial year shall be transferred to CSR fund for implementation of the CSR activities during the current financial year. The fund shall be non lapsable. Recently as per companies Act 2013, section 135 CSR has been made mandatory for all public & private enterprises.

THDCIL has started taking up CSR-CD activities since 2007. THDCIL vision statement includes Commitment to Environment, Ecology and Social Values commonly called the Triple Bottom Line. The scheme addresses the issue of "Community Development" in the neighbourhood area of operating power generation stations where construction has been completed and other business area of Corporation. The scheme sets out the commitment of THDCIL as a company to operate in an economically, socially and environmentally sustainable manner, while recognizing the interests of its stakeholders. CSR is, therefore, closely linked with the practice of Sustainable Development.

2. SCOPE OF WORK:

THDC India Ltd. every year signs MoU with Ministry of Power. During FY 2013-14 also various targets were set out under the head Corporate Social Responsibility. List of activities are as per Annexure 1.

All activities under scope of work have been completed for which evaluation and impact assessment is to be done to check the effectiveness of the projects being implemented for benefit of the rural population especially the women, youth & environmental conservation etc.

Undersigned was entrusted with the task of evaluation and impact assessment work of 03 nos Cutting and tailoring training centers out of 05 center and plantation work done as per MOU at Project affected area of 04 number blocks namely Pratapnagar, Thauldhar, Jakhnidhar & Narendra Nagar in district Tehri to Law Pralash check the survival rate of the plants.

3. VISIT TO TEHRI SITE

For evaluation and impact assessment of above projects site visit was conducted on 4th & 5th July 2014 by the undersigned. The report is based on my personal site visit observation with Sri Rakesh Uniyal, Officer (Env.), THDCIL, Rishikesh and Sh. M.S. Rana, Officer, CSR unit, THDCIL, Tehri. For this purpose direct feedbacks were taken from the beneficiaries. Details are as under:

3.1. Women Empowerment Centre at Project Affected Area:

SEWA-THDC established 05 nos. women empowerment centres in affected area in Tehri District under the MOU target 2013-14. As per the obligatory requirement of documentation, evaluation report from external agency is required to be done. Out of 05nos centers; 03 nos women empowerment centers evaluated randomly. Discussion held in healthy atmosphere with the executing agency, their staff and beneficiaries available near the centre.

3.1.1. Cutting & Tailoring Centre (Gadolia):

A cutting and tailoring centre has been established by Sewa-THDC at Gadolia, Jakhnidhar block, Tehri for skill development and livelihood of project affected women of Gadolia and nearby villages. This was a six month programme implemented from 25-09-2013 To 24-03-2014. As Per record 53 Nos. beneficiaries had been enrolled for training at this centre. Training is complete. The name of the executing agency is M/s Rajeshwari Bal Evam Mahila Kalian Samiti, Gram-Pindolo, P.O. Malyakot, Nailchami, Tehri Garhwal. Trainer was Mr. Shohan Lal, Mobile No. 8937078360 and assiatant Trainer Miss. Pooja Negi, Mobile No. 9634776466 was also present at that time.

At the centre, undersigned met with number of persons and discussed about the issues of the area and benefits of the Tailoring center running by Sewa-THDC. Sh Vijay Singh Kumai a resident of Gadolia & shop owner informed that villagers are happy with the efforts of THDCIL. They also informed that similar training programme should be conducted at regular intervals. an Prahash Everybody was genuinely satisfied with the performance of the center and the trainees.

During discussion with trainees informed that they have been benefited a lot. This essential skill was lacking because of lack of resources in past. It was found that most of the women trainees are now engaged in some kind of tailoring work along with their house hold duties. The executing agency and beneficiaries both demanded subsidiary tailoring instruments and raw material like buttons, elastic etc. One of the beneficiaries smt. Reena Negi, Mobile no 8755341442 informed that the training was beneficial in terms of their skill development especially in stitching & cutting of ladies & child garments etc. She further informed that with her present knowledge she is now earning around Rs 2000/- pm. Some of the beneficiaries demanded that the advance training should also be given to them to give edge to their learning. The beneficiaries are now more confident and have shown eagerness to become economically independent in near future.

3.1.2. Cutting & Tailoring Centre (Asena):

A cutting and tailoring centre has been established by Sewa-THDC at Asena, Jakhnidhar block, Tehri for skill development and livelihood of project affected women of Asena and nearby villages. This was a six month programme implemented from 25-09-2013 To 24-03-2014. As per record 40 Nos. beneficiaries had been enrolled for training at this centre. Training is complete. The name of the executing agency is M/s Rajeshwari Bal Evam Mahila Kalian Samiti, Gram- Pindolo, P.O. Malyakot, Nailchami, Tehri Garhwal. Trainer was Mr. Sunder Das.

At this centre, undersigned met with villagers and discussed about the issues of the area and also about the benefits of tailoring project running in their village by Sewa-THDC. They were happy that Sewa-THDC is taking interest in their welfare. They were of the feeling that after completion of the dam; THDCIL officials will never come for their welfare.

Later on discussions were held with the beneficiaries and the staff of the executing agency. Everybody was genuinely satisfied with the performance of the center and the trainees. During discussion trainees informed that they have been benefited a lot as they were lacking this essential skill. It was found that most of the women trainees are now engaged in some kind of tailoring work along with their house hold duties. The beneficiaries Smt. Han Prahath

Reena, Mobile No. 8171325560, Seema, Ram Lal etc informed that the training was beneficial to them in terms of their skill development especially in stitching & cutting of ladies & child garments etc. She further informed that with her present knowledge she is now earning around Rs 2000/- pm. Some of the beneficiaries demanded that the advance training should also be given to them to give edge to their learning. The beneficiaries are now more confident and have shown eagerness to become economically independent in near future. Some of the beneficiaries also demanded some kind of financial aid and assistance or micro finance facilities so that they can start new business or enterprises on their own. Beneficiaries of this project also reported that their participation in various family decisions like education of child, savings etc. has significantly increased.

3.1.3. Cutting & Tailoring Centre (Madan Negi):

A cutting and tailoring centre has been established by Sewa-THDC at Madan Negi, Pratapnagar block, Tehri for skill development and livelihood of project affected women of Madan Negi and nearby villages. This was a six month programme implemented from 25-10-2013 to 24-04-2014. Approximate 27 no. beneficiaries had been enrolled for training at this centre. Training is complete. The name of the executing agency is M/s Gramin Gan Vikash Sansthan, Rataldhar, P.O. Raimar, Distt. Uttrakashi. Trainer was Mr... Raghubir Singh Rawat, Mobil No. 9536382965 and Assistant Trainer Mr. Vijendra Kumar, Mobile No.9719358770.

In this village Sh M.S.Panwar, Associate Professor, Geography. HNB Garhwal Central University is involved in implementation of several SEWA-THDC CSR projects in nearby villages. Villagers of the area were happy & satisfied with the efforts of THDCIL for their upliftment and welfare. The main issue of the area as found is health, quality education, connectivity, transportation, safe drinking water etc. Public transportation is not available from district head quarter to Pratapnagar villages.

At this centre, undersigned again met with villagers and discussed about the issues of the area and also about the benefits of tailoring project running in their village by SEWA-THDC. They were happy that SEWA-THDC is taking interest in their welfare.

Later on discussions were held with the beneficiaries and the staff of the executing agency. Everybody was genuinely satisfied with the performance Lan Prahath

of the center and the trainees. During discussion trainees informed that they have been benefitted a lot as they were lacking this essential skill. It was found that most of the women trainees are now engaged in some kind of tailoring work along with their house hold duties. The beneficiaries. Informed that the training was beneficial to them in terms of their skill development especially in stitching & cutting of ladies & child garments etc. Some of the beneficiaries demanded that the advance training should also be given to them to give edge to their learning. The beneficiaries are now more confident and have shown eagerness to become economically independent in near future. Some of the beneficiaries also demanded some kind of financial aid and assistance or micro finance facilities so that they can start new business or enterprises on their own. Beneficiaries of this project also reported that their participation in various family decisions like education of child, savings etc. has significantly increased.

PLANTATION WORK IN DISTRICT TEHRI 3.2.

3.2.1. Plantation In Jakhnidhar Block

Plantation sites in 4 block namely, Jhaknidhar, Partap Nagar, Thuldhar and Narendrea Nagar respectively. Sites were visited on 04th & 5th july 2014. As per the available record 14750 number of fruit & soil bindings plants viz Mango, Guava, Citrus, Bel , Aonla, Bamboo, Kachnar, Shisam, Banj , Padam & Annga have been planted in 75 villages. Though it was difficult task to locate the plants because of the difficult geographical terrain, however, 15 villages out of 75 villages were visited randomly to check the actual status and survival of the plants. Discussions were also held with the villagers about their issues & efforts of THDCIL for their welfare. Many of them were of the view that problems will always remain but the concern shown by THDCIL is appreciable. They informed that many other projects are also running in their villages as well as in other locations benefitting especially the women and the youth. They further demanded that more water tanks and pipelines be provided in water starved areas to meet their minimum requirement. It was further informed that damaged pipelines during natural calamities may also be repaired by THDCIL. Women in some of the areas are covering large distances to bring water. Because of shortage of water, farmers are no more interested in taking up agriculture as occupation and encouraging their children to go for job in convenient Low Prahash places.




