



## **Evaluation and Impact Assessment Report of CSR Projects**

THDC India Ltd. is implementing various CSR projects in uttarakhand through the SEWA-THDC, a company sponsored NGO of THDCIL. The evaluation and impact assessment work of CSR Projects are also carried out through SEWA-THDC. Undersigned was also awarded evaluation and impact assessment work of 03 CSR Projects vide letter No SEWA-THDC/ RKSH/14-15/016, dated April 18, 2014.

For evaluation and impact assessment of above projects site visit was conducted on 23<sup>rd</sup>, 24<sup>th</sup>, 25<sup>th</sup> April 2014 and 20<sup>th</sup> May 2014. The report is based on my personal site visit observation with Sri S.D. Uniyal, Manager (social), CSR unit, Tehri. For this purpose direct feedbacks were taken from the beneficiaries. Detail is as under:

1. Construction of Academic Block for 3<sup>rd</sup> year in THDC-IHET (Engineering College), Bhagirathipuram, Tehri.



THDCIL has established the first Hydropower development institute and engineering college in India and Asia. Its first batch of 240 students joined the class for the academic session 2011-12. Now this batch is studying in 3<sup>rd</sup> year. Recently its 3<sup>rd</sup> year academic block has been completed in the F.Y. 2013-14. This block has all the basic facilities like class rooms, laboratories, seminar halls etc. Total area of this block is about 2500 sq. meters. Its budget allocation is about approx. ₹ 555 Lac. In 3<sup>rd</sup> year four engineering branches i.e. Civil, Electrical, Mechanical and Electronics are running. Uttarakhand technical board reserved 05% seat for the children of project affected persons in this institute. This college is affiliated to Uttarakhand Technical University. Total no. of faculty are 31. All faculties are on contractual basis.

This table shows that this institute is beneficial for Dubchhetra and THDC employees also. This institute is situated near Dibnu and Bagi gram sabhas. Due to such infrastructure it is also beneficial for its surrounding areas. It also generated some employment for local people.

## 2. Modernisation of 05 Nos water flour mills (Gharats) in Bhilangana Block, Tehri distt.

Gharats or Water flour mills run on a stream's kinetic energy to turn the shaft of the grinding mill. It is ecological effective traditional way to get grain grounded and best possible way to utilize the available resources. Hence its survival is not only important in light of their eco suitability but to acknowledge the powerful indian traditional knowledge as well.

SEWA-THDC has upgraded 05 no. of gharats in Bhilangana block of tehri distt through UREDA. These gharats are upgraded according to specific budget allocations, terms and conditions. A baseline survey has been conducted to select the beneficiaries. Upgradation of such traditional watermills can be great soure of employment generation. In future these gharats can be used to provide electiricity to 15-20 families within the diameter of 500 meters.



Gharat at gram Thapla



This gharat is at a little distance away from the village. In spite of this at the time of our visit this gharat was running. No one was there. Door of gharat room was just bolted, not locked. Sri Mohanlal Kothiyal was not aware about whose grains are being grinded. He said that his 5 member family is dependent on this gharat. People leave his share of ground cereals themselves. Apart from this share he does not charge any money for grinding grain. He is very satisfied with the upgraded gharat and grateful to the THDC-SEWA for support. He said that grinding capacity of this upgraded gharat has increased three times than the old traditional gharat.

### (iii) Gharats at Gram Ghuttu:

At The time of our visit the owner Sri Mahaveer Singh was not present. He had gone to attend a marriage. He was not there but his gharat was running at its full capacity. This gharat is situated near the Ghuttu market. Due to its prime location it is running 24 hours. Here we also observed the system of barter exchange. People leave some ground grain for the owner as his share.

### (iv) Gharats at Gram Sankari:

Sri Bachchan Singh is an old poor man. He is very happy with his new upgraded gharat. This gharat lacks proper approach. Due to this few people come here .In spite of this Sri Bachchan Singh is optimistic about it. He is trying to make approach easy. He is also very grateful to THDC-SEWA for its support.






